Please put a check mark by all the skills the student has mastered. Keep in mind that SMMC's emphasis is on rapid learning and performing a wide variety of music. It is recommended that all players have previous ensemble experience & be well advanced in the command of their instrument. Confidence in sight-reading & advanced control of intonation & tone quality is expected for the symphony. **All musicians will be asked to sight-read during the audition process to ascertain ability.**

The **Advanced Orchestra** is an advanced full string orchestra. The students in this orchestra are generally in high school or the upper grades of middle school. Advanced players solos should be of the level required for CMEA Capital Section Honor Orchestra, or solos rated level 4 & above. The **Orchestra** is an intermediate level strings group.

All string students should be currently working on a standard method book, level 2, such as "All for Strings," or "Essential Elements for Strings," or above.

Intermediate Student: Should be working in, at the very least, Suzuki book 2 or the equivalent.

- Be able to read first position notes on all 4 strings without difficulty.
- 1 octave scales, major keys: C, G, D, F
- Be able to respond to accidentals.
- Understand basic simple meters (2/4, 3/4, 4/4) & basic rhythm patterns with whole, half, quarter, 8th, 16th notes/rests
- Have begun 3rd position if he/she plans on trying out for first violin.
- Know martelé, détaché, and legato bowing.

Advanced Student: All of the above as well as be studying in Suzuki book 4 or equivalent to be safe (book 3 will be considered for 2nd violin.)

- 2 – 3 Octave scales, major scale in quarter notes at a tempo of 144, minor scale in quarter notes at a tempo of 120
- Understand simple & compound meters (4/4, 6/8, etc)
- Be comfortable in 3rd position and know some additional positions.
- Be able to play keys that have up to 3 or 4 sharps or flats.
- Have prior orchestra/ensemble experience. Includes advanced skills in following a conductor.
- Have advanced sight-reading skills
- Have mature concentration level/and be seriously motivated.
- Be able to respond to accidentals
- Know martelé, détaché, and legato bowing. Be able to use vibrato.
